MIC ANNUAL REPORT - 2020

Economic Development

•Provided Paycheck Protection Program assistance and information to MIC sponsors

•Supported new and existing businesses by offering Grand Opening or Re-Opening Ceremonies with an associated marketing campaign.

•Celebrated Cobb County's first Façade Grant for the office building at 5501 Mableton Parkway.

•Raised community exposure to work opportunities and job training programs with Jobs Spotlight in MIC newsletter

•Assisted new and existing businesses in researching county services and funding that could be used to relocate to Mableton

Parks

•Successfully advocated for the construction of parking and trails at the new 103-acre park on Discovery Boulevard, and for the park's name – Discovery Park at the River Line

•Provided input to the Parks Department on the selection of the new playground for the Mableton Town Square

•Raised funding for benches, tables and waste bins for the Mableton Town Square from Mableton businesses, organizations, and individual donors

•Encouraged the adoption of a Master Plan for the Henderson Road park property, 23 acres on Veterans Memorial Highway

•Advocated for 2020 SPLOST funding for Henderson Road Park and the Bartlett Property

Community Development

•Grew the Homeowner Association (HOA) Network from 9 to 18 members. The HOA Network was established to bring Mableton subdivisions together for networking and collaboration and published the HOA Network Coronavirus Guide

•Managed the **Historic Mableton Community Garden** on Floyd Road, including a successful fundraising campaign and increased community involvement

•Encouraged participation in the 2020 Census, resulting in a high participation rate in the Mableton area

•Expanded Adopt-A-Mile litter pick-ups along major corridors and communities

•Continued service by MIC Board Member as a District 4 representative on Cobb County's Keep Cobb Beautiful board.

•Organized community volunteers to provide Secret Santa gifts for more than 70 children at the Mableton **Boys & Girls Club**

•Supported the *Center For Family Resources* with clothing donations for children

•Distributed face masks and hand sanitizer to groups and individuals

•Teamed with **MUST Ministries** on the food distribution program at Floyd Middle School



MIC ANNUAL REPORT 2020 - (cont'd)

Outreach and Community Events

•Held one Community Meeting focused on Zoning and Code Enforcement (January), and then with the pandemic, pivoted to a series of success online forums.

•Held five virtual candidate forums were held for Primary and General Election candidates, in partnership with the Austell Community Taskforce and the Powder Springs Community Taskforce

•Held two virtual community forums on racial justice, in partnership with the Austell Community Taskforce and the Powder Springs Community Taskforce

•Held two additional community forums: our annual Education Summit and a forum on How Elections Work

•Published monthly e-newsletters, promoting events and resources in Mableton, and updated readers on zoning, transportation and other community-related issues

•Grew MIC e-newsletter to over 2,200 subscribers

•Grew the MIC Facebook Community group to nearly 3,300 members

• Published dozens of blog posts on MIC's website to provide in-depth information supporting newsletter and social media articles

•Launched MIC's own YouTube channel -Mableton Improvement Coalition Land Use (Zoning)

•To advance the best development and redevelopment, advocated for Mableton in a record 24 zoning cases

•Defeated a proposal to build a cement plant on Riverview Road, within several hundred feet of the Chattahoochee River

•Continued participation in the Chattahoochee Riverlands working group, which aims to re-imagine the River from Buford Dam to Chattahoochee Bend State Park

Provided input for amendments to the county's Future Land Use Map
Advocated for and secured the public's access to virtual participation in zoning hearings as a safety measure during the pandemic

Capacity Building and Fundraising

•Continued to grow MIC's corporate sponsor program to over 30 businesses •Grew MIC's volunteer force and membership

•Continued to utilize the Mableton Community Fund, MIC's 501c3 supporting organization for donations and grants for MIC's charitable programs

Education

•Partnered with MIC Sponsors to donate Dell laptops to Lindley Middle School

- •Participated in planning and financially supporting Lindley Middle Outdoor Learning Center
- •Helped establish the South Cobb High School Foundation

•Continued our support the Clay Harmony Leland Foundation, a conduit for charitable giving to the school

- •Held a virtual Education Summit with residents and school principals from Floyd Middle School, Lindley 6th Grade Academy, Pebblebrook High School, and South Cobb High School for a MIC Community Forum
- •Amplified attendance and community support at school activities via social media postings

•Supported local PTSA and School Council efforts at South Cobb High School and Lindley Middle School

•Supported Austell Community Task Force's Back to School Program
