- Hosted Education Forum covering Senate Bill 48 addressing Dyslexia and Senate Bill 1084 addressing Divisive Concepts.
- Literacy Development Program during November Literacy Month.
- Collaborated with **Braves Foundation on several** education initiatives.
- Appeared at Cobb County School Board meetings to advocate for local schools.
- Donated to establish first golf team for16 young men and women at Pebblebrook HS.
- Supported Young Entrepreneur Club at Pebblebrook HS.
- Supported STEAM College tours, Annual School Book Bags and Supplies Drive and Fundraisers.
- Recognized and supported Teacher Appreciation Week.

## **Economic Development**

- Taste of Mableton generated over 6,000 attendees, participation of 16 food vendors and food trucks, 10 local entertainment/artists, 15 non-profits, 4 government agencies, and 3 schools.
- Economic Development Summit attracted 150 small businesses, elected officials, and strategic partners.
- Created the MIC Excellence Awards and presented first time awardees during Economic Development Summit.
- Several Ribbon Cuttings welcoming and celebrating major new business openings.

### Parks and Trails

- Established Park Ambassadors to monitor parks and report problems back to the Board and Parks Department.
- Participated in Trust for Public Land's Chattahoochee Riverhead Trail Steering Committee overseeing the development of the Mableton showcase trail.

#### Zoning

- Reviewed and analyzed 37 zoning cases, continuing to be a driving force in county land use process.
- Provided recommendations to MIC board for their vote on MIC's position on zoning applications.
- Monitored zoning decision compliance in the Mableton area.
- Attended and spoke at Board of Commission (BOC) and Planning Commission (PC) meetings.
- Met frequently with applicants, developers, commissioners, and residents about cases.
- Attended Commissioner Sheffield's 'In the Zone' meetings and held community meetings as needed.

### Internal

- Achieved 8 of 10 objectives established for the year.
- Membership increased 29%.
- MIC attracted 12 new sponsors and successfully grew the MIC sponsorship list to 46.
- By-Laws were updated and new guidelines set for membership and board eligibility.
- Adopted policy to expand membership to the entire city of Mableton, beyond 30126 zip code.
- The brand logo, signature line and graphics were updated and introduced into the website, newsletter, social media, flyers and power point format.
- Expanded MIC Board of Directors from 11 to 13 members.
- The Mableton Community Fund (MCF), a 501 (C3) affiliate, was re-structured in October 2023.
